## **Committee Background:**

Press Corps is a unique committee designed to represent an international news agency devoted to covering the major events across the CISIMUN 2026. Journalists have the responsibility to report with a diplomatic stance and demonstrate abilities such as writing, research, analysis, and creative skills to engage in the craft of writing articles during the lapse of the committee.

## **Background information**

As a journalist of this committee, your role is to report on your assigned MUN debate with the specific writing style of each news agency. Creating a portfolio with articles, interviews, press conferences, and photographic evidence.

**Each agency is expected to submit the following items to complete its portfolio:**

- 1. Printed Position Paper:** Reflecting and analyzing the posture and writing style of your news agency.
  - **Header:** Name of the newspaper, committee, conference, name of journalist, personal email (preferably Gmail).
  - **Introduction**
  - **Paragraph 1 (Editorial line & Political orientation):** Your newspaper's political stance, relationship to the government, and how this shapes your reporting approach.
  - **Paragraph 2 (Writing style and Journalistic methods):** Analyze your news agency tone, headline style, manner, and style.
  - **Paragraph 3 (Priority Issues at This Mun):** This is where you connect your news agency to the MUN environment.
  - **Conclusion.**



2. **Written Articles:** 1 article per day of your assigned committee. Reporters are allowed to observe committees, listen, and take notes to produce the best articles that align with the provided format and instructions. Journalists can send notes
3. **Photographic evidence:** Each article should have a minimum of two photographs of the committee.
4. **Press Conferences:** (Optional and can be added to one of the two Articles) Reporters will enter a committee to ask delegates questions about the topic under discussion. Journalists can ask questions for a maximum of 5 minutes and can use the gathered information in the draft of their article.
5. **Interviews:** (Optional and can be added to one of the two Articles) Journalists are allowed to interview a specific delegate of the committee.
